...from the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents,

I am happy to report that once again SCC students, parents, and friends served and delivered over 400 meals to the needy of the area on Thanksgiving morning. Through the efforts of Mr. Poncho Roussel and Marathon-Ashland, this service project continues to grow each year. Thanks to all students and parents who came out on Wednesday and Thursday to cook, serve, and deliver meals.



It is with much excitement that I introduce to you a new tradition at SCC. It is an event known as **Prom Fest**. It has been established at many high schools in the metro New Orleans area and has been a huge success. It began because parents wanted to provide a sensible and enjoyable alcohol and drug-free celebration following proms. As a community, I feel that is imperative that we offer to our students an alternative to the downtown New Orleans area and other inappropriate activities that follow proms. This event is fun-filled and provides students the opportunity to win some extravagant prizes.

Members of our staff and several parents have been working with the Prom Fest committee at Chapelle High School to gather details and planning strategies. In their first year Chapelle had about 50% attendance. Last year, 99% of their seniors attended Prom Fest and all but 4 of those remained until the event ended at 4 a.m.

The first request we have for you is for your support. There are many "prom traditions" that have been established. Many of those are very positive, such as parents feeding groups of couples before or after the prom. We would like those traditions to continue. There are some traditions that we would like to see eliminated. We know that many students wait for "their turn" at things and it will be difficult for our seniors to make such a drastic change. This event has essentially eliminated the need for limousines because of the time allotted to arrive at Prom Fest after the prom ends. With your help, we can convince them that Prom Fest can be one of those special events that they will never forget.

Basically, this is how it works. Our prom ends at midnight. Students will have one hour to go home to change and arrive at SCC. Students and their dates will check in and receive a gift bag as they arrive. They will have an abundance of games and contests to play; and as they play, they earn tickets which they can use to take chances on prizes. In addition to the "fair type" games, there is also karaoke, dance contests, sumo wrestling, and spacewalks. The prizes range in value from small gift certificates through laptop computers and televisions. There are 4 "major prizes" that are given away at the end of the night, and students must be present to win. There are also unlimited soft drinks and food (jambalaya, chicken, finger sandwiches, pizza, desserts.) Oh, by the way-Prom Fest is free of charge for students.

I must tell you that this is a huge undertaking. We understand that it will require as many as 80-100 volunteers and a tremendous amount of work to ensure success. It also takes financial resources. Chapelle's budget is capped at \$15,000. Most of their funding comes from school events that donate proceeds to Prom Fest. We have to be realistic in our planning and realize that we have to walk before we run.

Our PTO has already donated \$2,000 to get us started. Our biggest need right now is prizes. If you have any business connections that would be willing to donate products or services, please make that connection for us. It is vital that you document **any** donation made to this event. Organizers at Chapelle stressed that their retention of sponsors has been tremendous because each donor gets a thank you card regardless of the size of the gift. I also encourage you to donate a prize. You can take advantage of the sales during the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays. Prizes can be anything! (Please see attachment for prize ideas.) Chapelle's Prom Fest is for their seniors, so many of their prizes are geared toward dorm rooms. They give away cordless phones, sheets and pillow cases, luggage, tools, coffee pots, and many other items. We would like to make a commitment that each student that attends would be guaranteed to win something. We will have the potential for nearly 400 students to attend.

The first official organizational meeting will be held Wednesday, December 7 at 6 p.m. in the library. We will lay out the committees and their responsibilities. We hope that you will consider joining us for another first for SCC and the River Parishes. As usual, your support is vital if we are to be successful. Thank you for your consideration.

Departmentionables

Art- Art I students are finishing their study of modern and contemporary art, while Art II students are working hard on one, two, and three point perspectives. Art III is beginning "Self-portraits in Context." Thanks to all students who worked on the "Friendship Through Chaos" board in the cafeteria and pep rally projects. Family and Consumer Sciences- Students will continue their study of nutrition. Reading recipes, safety, and cooking methods will close out the 2nd nine weeks. The Child Development class is studying physical, social, and intellectual development of children to age four. Students will make observations at local pre-schools.



Social Studies- Mr. Stein's Louisiana History class is studying French and Spanish exploration. His World geography classes are studying Canada. Mr. Waguespack's World Geography classes are studying the United States. His World History class is studying Greece. Mr. Monica's World History classes are studying the Greek and Roman Empires. Mrs. Buras' World History class is also studying the Greek civilization. Ms. Vanderbrook's American History honors classes will be studying the late 1800's and early 1900's. Her American History academic classes will be studying the period after the Civil War. The AP American History class will be studying the period leading up to the Civil War. Mrs. Graham-Bologna's Psychology classes were very grateful to have two inspirational speakers when they were studying sensations and perceptions. Melissa Deroche (SCC Class of 92) and Coach Bennie Benedetto both came to speak to her classes. Everyone left with a better understanding of their senses.



Language Arts- Intermediate Composition Honors and Academic classes recently turned in their first project of the year. Designed to assist students in writing more effectively, these projects included various types of writing. Meanwhile, students in Language and Composition AP have a Photo Essay Project due before the Christmas holidays. The staff of the *Entre' Nous* (yearbook) have received assignments to begin designing pages for the 2005-06 book. They are anxiously awaiting the delivery of the 2005 book; however they may not arrive until January.



Religion- Juniors completed a project before the Thanksgiving holidays designed to challenge them to put practical

concepts and vocabulary words to use. Students chose a movie or television show clip that illustrated a moral issue. The analysis of the clip (both oral and written) and the ability to stay within the allotted time were criteria for earning grades. Students enjoyed viewing the various movies and hearing the interpretations of scenes from new movies and previously viewed movies. Sophomore classes have been studying the gospels of Mark and Matthew. After the Christmas holidays, they will complete their study of the New Testament.



Math- All classes are moving "full speed ahead" and will continue to do so until exams. It is easy for students to be sidetracked by the hustle and bustle of the approaching holidays. Please remind them that the nine weeks grading period is not over until they have taken the last exam. It is important for students to be at school every day, complete assignments, and prepare for tests. New topics will be part of the second nine weeks exams. Encourage your children to start preparing a little at a time each day so that they are not overwhelmed the day before the exam. There are sure to be many things happening at the same time. Make math a priority!

SENIOR PARENT CONFERENCE REPORT

Mrs. Graham-Bologna would like to thank the seniors and their parents for their attendance at the meeting held Monday, November 14, 2005.

- ◆ Please sign off on the two transcripts that you were given and return them to Mrs. Graham-Bologna as soon as possible.
- ◆ The financial aid meeting that was requested by parents is being planned for late January. The financial aid office from Nicholls State and the Office of Student Financial Assistance have been contacted. The date will be announced when plans are confirmed.
- ◆ When thinking about your financial plans for next year, Mrs. Graham-Bologna would like to remind you that when you are attending a state college or university, the TOPS scholarship is an amount equal to tuition only. You will be responsible for housing and fees.
- ◆ LSU, Nicholls State, Northwestern State, Louisiana Tech, and UL-Monroe are all accepting online transcripts from the Department of Education so you do not have to send a separate transcript unless they require it individually from you. UL-Lafayette, Centenary, and LA College are still requiring paper transcripts.
- ◆ Those students who apply for TOPS by submitting the FAFSA without the income-related information or the on-line application will be the first to lose their award in the event of a budget shortfall.

IT'S ACT TIME, JUNIORS!!

ACT Fee waivers: If you have not used a fee waiver for the December ACT test date, you are eligible to use one for the February test date. The fee waivers are available in Mrs. Graham-Bologna's office. **Juniors and seniors are eligible for the waiver.** Paper applications are required when using the waiver. These are also available in Mrs. Graham-Bologna's office.

SAT Fee waivers: Mrs. Graham-Bologna also has fee waivers for the upcoming SAT test for seniors. If you use an SAT fee waiver, you are eligible to apply to waive college application fees for participating institutions. To find out which schools are participating, check the 2005-06 Directory of Colleges booklet in Mrs. Graham-Bologna's office.

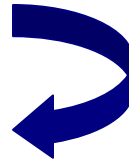

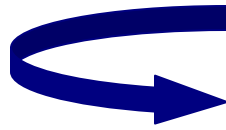

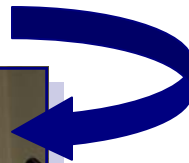
