## Departmentionables

**Art-** Art I students are finishing their study of modern and contemporary art, while Art II students are working hard on one, two, and three point perspectives. Art III is beginning "Self-portraits in Context." Thanks to all students who worked on the "Friendship Through Chaos" board in the cafeteria and pep rally projects. **Social Studies-** Coach Stein's Louisiana History class is studying Spanish colonization. His World Geography classes are studying Brazil. Coach Waguespack's World Geography classes are studying Latin America. His World History class is studying the Aztecs and Incas and early America. Coach Monica's World History classes are studying the Crusades. Mrs. Buras' World History class is studying the civilization of the Americas. Ms. Vanderbrook's American History academic classes are studying how the United States became a world power and then will be learning about World War I. Her American History honors classes will be studying about the Great Depression and World War II. Ms. Vanderbrook's AP American History class is studying about the Civil War. Sgt. Andy Breaux (Class of '85) will visit Mrs. Bologna's psychology class. He will perform a polygraph test on one of the students. This demonstration and lecture is pertinent to the physiological component of emotions. The class is finishing the chapter on motivation and emotion. They now understand how important it is to have specific mini-goals to attain long term goals! fully be able to master just about any type of essay given to them on the college level.

Mrs. Fauchoux's **English IV & V - AP** classes are reading *1984* and are doing concentrated work on sample AP tests. They will also be reading *Gulliver's Travels* this nine weeks. Her **English 8** students are currently working on verbs: their uses and forms. Soon they will cover subject - verb agreement. In other words, "old-fashioned" grammar will be the focus this nine weeks.



**Math-** What is going on in the Mathematics Department? Teachers are busy selecting students for the District Literary Rally coming up in March. Students who are selected will compete in their particular subject area against other schools from the district. What is happening in the classroom? Mr. Tanner's calculus class is preparing for the AP exam. His advanced math class is preparing for the ACT test in the spring in addition to regular class work. In Geometry class Mr. Tanner is introducing a new game, sudoku, that deals with number patterns. Mr. Simon's Algebra II students are finding out how much fun quadratic functions can be, and Coach Z's advanced math classes are finding out how much fun trig functions can be. Mrs. Deroche's Algebra II classes are solving systems of equations and her geometry class is studying special parallelograms. Finally, Coach Ty & Mrs. Falgoust's Algebra I classes are busy learning how to graph.



**Language Arts-** The **Journalism I and II** classes are excited about the arrival of the 2005 yearbook. While the book does contain a few errors, the students were quite happy to receive them. Graduates of 2005 may come to the office between 8:00 and 2:30 to pick up their books.



Mrs. Bordelon's **Language and Composition - AP** students have taken notes on how to master a multiple choice test, in preparation for taking the AP test in May. For the next few months they will concentrate on different areas of the test. Grammar will be the first section covered. Students will review different aspects of grammar and take various tests to evaluate where their strengths and weaknesses are.

## Football Team Makes History

In a year of many firsts, the Comet football team rode a wave of momentum into the playoffs and went further than any other Comet team in history. SCC played in the State Championship Game in Shreveport against fellow District 10 member John Curtis. The Comets were defeated 31-6. Senior Chris Jones was named MVP for SCC. The Comets began their playoff run with a 48-6 victory over Farmer-ville. Then they traveled to St. James for the second time in

three weeks and defeated the Wildcats after a heart-stopping finish. The Comets ventured to north Louisiana to face Jonesboro-Hodge and dropped the Wildcats 48-6. SCC returned home to face number one seeded Sterlington. SCC blanked the Panthers 23-0 to secure their birth in the Nokia Sugar Bowl Classic. ### **LSU Spring Testing (April 5th-7th)**

Initial invitations eligibility requirements are as follows: 1.) an ACT of 28 or greater (SAT of 1240 or greater) and 2.) minimum of 3.2 GPA. You must be admitted to LSU before February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2006 to be invited. If you meet these requirements, you should receive an invitation in early Feb. If space is available after March 3, 2006, additional students may be invited on a tiered criteria basis. The criteria will be posted on Mrs. Graham-Bologna's door. There are no longer counselor recommendation invitations.

**SENIORS APPLICATION FOR TOPS**

In order to apply for a TOPS scholarship, students must submit one of the following:

1. Students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid ([www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)), unless they can demonstrate that they do not qualify for federal grant aid (Pell Grant). **We recommend that all students submit the FAFSA.**

FAFSA: Free Application for Federal Student Aid ([www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)),

Be leary of scams: **There is no fee to file the FAFSA. If you are at a website that charges a fee, you are being scammed!!**

You can file the FAFSA now. Mrs. Graham-Bologna recommends filing electronically because you will save at least two weeks processing time. There are several advantages to electronic filing. You can receive online help, and there is a "skip logic" feature- students are only asked questions that apply to them. You will also get an immediate EFC (expected family contribution amount) estimate.

Students should verify the financial aid deadline for the institution they are attending. Check online or in the catalog of the school to which you are applying. All students are required to submit the FAFSA by May 1 to be eligible for state aid and for the TOPS priority deadline.

When filling out this form, it is suggested that you fill out yes to questions #33 & 34, which ask if you are interested in programs in addition to grants. You can always refuse further help later.

When filling out this form, it is suggested that you list at least one LA school on questions #86-97. This information is electronically submitted to LOSFA (for TOPS).

2. Students who can demonstrate that they do not qualify for federal grant aid may submit either the FAFSA, with all applicable sections completed except the income-related sections, OR the TOPS on-line application on the LOSFA website. The on-line application will require students to certify that they do not qualify for federal grant aid and to certify their citizenship, residency, and criminal conviction status.

**THOSE STUDENTS WHO APPLY FOR TOPS BY SUBMITTING THE FAFSA WITHOUT THE INCOME-RELATED INFORMATION OR THE ON-LINE APPLICATION WILL BE THE FIRST TO LOSE THEIR AWARD IN THE EVENT OF A BUDGET SHORTFALL.**

**Student Section-** The Comet Student Section has been a force at home and on the road for basketball games. Their sign board has been a highlight featuring some quick quips for opponents.

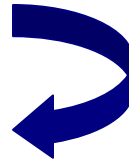

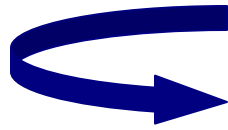

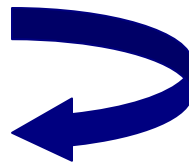
